The WE WILLS of Crane Operation

We will not operate a crane before a complete and thorough inspection is performed

We will turn off the crane remote prior to doing anything other than operating the crane

We will ensure that no-touch tools are used to position suspended loads

We will not turn our back or take our eyes off the load while the crane is in operation

We will cease crane operation prior to navigating ramps, stairs, or other obstructions

We will stay out of the danger zone and avoid flying a load over

We will understand our orientation and verify direction before fully operating the crane

We will meet our responsibilities for the practices defined in our Overhead Crane Program
